What truly makes TCIS special is our community—diverse, caring, and united by a shared purpose: to provide a nurturing and inspiring environment where every student can grow into their full potential.



Dear TCIS Family,



Dear Parents,

Math MAP scores were recently shared with students to discuss growth from the year, and action plans over the summer. You will also get a copy with final report cards. Please discuss these with your child, and take note of strengths and areas of focus.

All students should practice their math skills over the summer to avoid the “summer slide”. This can be done a number of ways.

All grade 5 students were assigned a “Get Ready for 6th Grade” course in Khan Academy. I highly recommend they complete this prior to grade 6. Additionally, both grades have recommended skills in IXL to continue working through.

Students can also play Prodigy or other math related games.

Dear Parents,

In this unit, students applied their understanding of percents to real-world financial situations. They calculated discounts, mark-ups, sales tax, and tips, and learned how to find percent of change in various contexts. Students also explored simple interest, gaining valuable tools for understanding savings, loans, and everyday money management.

Dear Parents,

These final weeks in Pre-Algebra have been very productive! Here's what's been happening:

Students finished up a unit on radicals and the pythagorean theorem. We learned about the basics of simplifying radicals with radical operations and used some algebra techniques to prove the pythagorean theorem. Students had a short summative assessment on these concepts during the second week of May.

Our last unit of the year will be on polynomial terminology, operations and an introduction to factoring. Students are currently revisiting the algebraic operations we covered in the beginning of the year, and then we will dive deeper into exponent rules, distributive property, greatest common factor, polynomial vocabulary, and the box method for factoring. We will then practice factoring using the GCF, difference of perfect squares and trinomial (with a leading coefficient of one) methods.

Our last summative is scheduled for June 5-6th. It's important that students work towards mastery of these skills to obtain the highest possible quarter 4 final grade. I'd recommend using delta math, watching the videos, checking out the worked examples and practicing as much as possible to ensure a high final mark! These skills will help them get prepared for Algebra 1 next year.

It's been a pleasure working with your children this year, and I hope you all have a great summer. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone again in August and wish them the best of luck with the rest of this school year and the beginning of the next! Our last cookie baking experiment will reinforce important lab concepts:

- Being prepared with careful measurements
- Following procedures for effective (and tasty!) results




Looking Forward to Next Year





Middle School students (TMT & TFT) practiced research, summarizing, and public speaking by presenting news stories to their classmates.





In G.7 MT, students composed songs using Thai diphthong word then created music videos—honing skills in time management, editing, and creativity.


Grade 8 TFT : Learning Thai through Real-Life Conversations




Yen Yen's Notan Story:


Alice's Notan Story:

The story behind my Notan artwork is that music and nature brings me happiness and feel at peace.





Grade 7

As we wrap up an exciting year in Grade 7 Robotics, our students took on their biggest challenge: the Sumobot Project! They built and programmed autonomous LEGO Sumobots to compete in a head-to-head sumo-style tournament. The project challenged students to apply the design process, use motors and sensors, and collaborate in teams to solve a real-world robotics challenge. Teams began by exploring EV3 or Spike Prime components, sketching designs, and planning strategies: offensive or defensive, while considering drivetrain styles and sensor integration. Robots were built within a strict size (20x20 cm) and weight (1.2 kg) limit, with an emphasis on balance and strength. Students programmed their bots to respond to the environment, using color sensors to detect the edge of the ring and ultrasonic or touch sensors to identify opponents. They tested and refined their builds through practice matches, adjusting their code and adding strategies like spinning or baiting. The project concluded with a fun and competitive tournament where students demonstrated their engineering and programming skills in action. I am proud of all the teams for their creativity, problem-solving, and teamwork!



Grade 8

To end the year, Grade 8 Robotics students took on the VEX EXP CatapultBot Build, a project designed to strengthen their engineering skills and prepare them for high school robotics. Teams built functional CatapultBots that could launch a projectile at least one meter, focusing on reliable launch mechanisms and improving accuracy, consistency, and range. They documented the full process in their Engineering notes, including design ideas, materials, build steps, testing data, challenges, and reflections. This project combined hands-on building with teamwork, problem-solving, and technical documentation which are key skills they will continue to build on in future robotics challenges. Well done Grade 8! See you all in High School robotics next academic year.

Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA)

The Thailand Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA)

- The Personal Data Protection Act B.E. 2562 (2019) (PDPA) was published on 27 May 2019 in Thailand's Government Gazette. ([English](#), [Thai](#))
- The PDPA is under the supervision of the Ministry of Digital Economy and Society and the main supervising authority of the PDPA is the Office of Data Protection Committee (Office).
- School is the "Data Controller" means a person or juristic person having decision-making on the collection, use, or disclosure of personal information (PDPA Section 6).

Personal Data	Sensitive Data
Any information relating to a natural person, which enables the identification of such person, whether directly or indirectly, but not including information of deceased persons.	<p>Any personal data pertaining to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • racial or ethnic origin • political opinions • religious or philosophical beliefs • sexual behavior • criminal records • health data, disability • trade union information • genetic data, biometric data, or any data which may affect the data subject in the same manner as to be prescribed by the PDPC.

In essence, the PDPA is designed to protect a data owner from the unauthorized or unlawful collection, use, or disclosure and processing of their personal data. As with Europe's GDPR, for example, websites will have to include simple and straightforward language, and receive clear consent from each user, before (or at the time of) collecting such data, using it in any way, or passing it along to third parties.

Another key aspect under the PDPA is the requirement to inform the data subject of (i) how their personal data will be used by the data controller, (ii) whether personal data will be disclosed to a third party, and (iii) of the data subject's rights to their personal data. This must be done at the time the personal data is being collected from the data subject.

The rights of data owners under the PDPA include the following:

- Right to be informed
- Right to access
- Right to data portability
- Right to object
- Right to erasure/ right to be forgotten
- Right to restrict of processing
- Right to rectify

Even foreign entities will need to follow the rules spelled out in the PDPA, as long as they deal with any activities that are related to the processing of personal data such as offering of goods and services or monitoring of users' online behavior, from users who are based in Thailand.

There are both criminal and civil liabilities for breaches of personal data privacy. For instance, the collection, use or disclosure of sensitive personal data illegally is liable to a fine of five million baht on conviction. Collection, use or disclosure of general personal data without a legal basis is liable to a three million baht fine on conviction, and failing to get consent from data's owner or refusing the data's owner access to their personal data is liable to a one million baht fine on conviction.

If the unauthorized use or disclosure of personal data causes damage to other people or subjects other people to hate, shame or contempt, violators may face six months in prison and/or a fine of 500,000 baht on conviction.

Nurse: School Health Services

The Nurse Clinic is a spacious and well staffed facility at TCIS that can accommodate several students at any given time of the day. The Nurse Clinic is open daily from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The clinic is located on the ground floor next to the storeroom and staffed by a registered nurse and one nurse's aid. The clinic treats all minor injuries occurring at school. The athletics program has a school nurse who works until the sports games finish.

The clinic stays in touch with the Ministry of Public Health to keep abreast of health notifications. Current vaccination information is sent out to parents for their information and written consent. Students in grade 1 thru grade 6 may get some vaccinations from our nurse according to the Thai Ministry of Public Health. Records of previous vaccinations are kept on file with the school nurse.

A worldwide, comprehensive (24-hour) accident insurance coverage is provided for all students up to 60,000 baht yearly.


